BALLOT FOR ELECTION TO BOARD OF COOPERATIVE EDUCATIONAL SERVICES

There are **four (4) vacancies** on the board of cooperative educational services to be filled at the annual election to be held on Monday, April 16, 2018. The trustees or board of education of each component school district, by resolution, may cast one vote for each vacancy to be filled, provided that no more than one vote may be cast for any candidate. No more than one person residing in a particular component school district may be elected to serve on the board of cooperative educational services at one time, except as provided in Education Law 1950(2a). The district clerk or other officer authorized to certify that a board resolution has been adopted, shall complete the ballot by placing an "X" next to the name of each candidate for whom a vote has been cast, and by completing the certification below.

The three candidates that receive the highest votes will receive the three-year terms ending on June 30, 2021. The fourth candidate will receive the term beginning on April 17, 2018 through June 30, 2020.
